Lesson 1:	 Curriculum Explain how children learn. Identify and describe the nine multiple intelligences. Describe the benefits of play and explain the six kinds of play. Explain how the teacher can facilitate play. Explain the essential elements for planning curriculum. Describe how to create lesson plans using the essential elements. Identify ways to adapt curriculum plans to meet the needs of individual children. Describe the purposes and benefits of group activities. 		
Lesson 2:	 Team Teaching Define team teaching and explain its benefits. Describe the essential elements for successful team teaching. Explain the potential challenges of team teaching. List the different styles of leadership and describe how they affect teacher roles. Identify and describe the stages of teacher development. Identify and explain different styles of conflict resolution. 		



Lesson 3: **Collaborating with Families** Define the word family and explain how it has evolved over the years. Explain the different cultural dimensions of families. Describe how different parenting styles affect children. Explain how to foster teacher-parent relationships and describe why these relationships are important. Explain common reasons that teachers feel reluctance about parent classroom participation. • Describe family involvement in the classroom, what it means, and the different forms it can take. Outline guidelines for parent-teacher conferences and explain how to communicate positively with parents. Lesson 4: The Dynamics of Diversity Identify the important components of diversity. Explain what *culture* is, and describe how it affects children and families. Define *race* and *ethnicity* and explain how they affect children. Explain how to connect with parents from other cultures. Identify issues of concern surrounding inclusion classrooms. Explain strategies for working with special needs children and their families. Categorize child behavior using common temperaments. Explain how teachers should address issues concerning diversity and bias.
